SDAA Shootout 1

Manado & Lembeh, Indonesia (10 Days / 9 Nights)

Diving into the heart of ocean biodiversity, our first Shootout is currently planned as a two-for-one, split between two of Indonesia's most sought-after dive destinations. First, one-of-a-kind Manado, on the doorstep of the Bunaken National Park. Steep coral reefs drop off to enormous depths, where the current can bring surprising pelagic encounters for adrenaline junkies. Next, transfer to the Lembeh Strait, where unusual and amazing critters can be encountered on every dive.
